







How to enable/disable -2Step Verification, an important security feature:




Step 1:

Log into your Gmail account and click on this link here.




Step 2:

You will see a screen like this. Click on "GET STARTED" (if you are doing this for the first time).



Step 3:


Re-enter the password for your account.



Step 4:


You will be asked to confirm your mobile phone number (if you are doing this for the first time).

You have a choice of two ways to do this: by text message (SMS) or by a phone call.




Step 5:

When you receive the verification code, enter it and click on "NEXT".







Step 6:

You will be asked to activate -2Step Verification by clicking on "TURN ON".


You have now activated the feature, choosing to use either voice or text messages to receive verification codes.

Step 7:

To add a second verification step, click on "Authenticator app".

Step 8:

Click on "Set up authenticator". A QR code will appear.




Step 9:

Download Google Authenticator on your mobile phone, then scan the QR Code that appears.



The digits you need to use will appear in Google Authenticator.



Step 10:

Click on "Next", then type the digits into the box and click on "Verify".



Once the code has been verified, this extra security step will automatically be activated to protect your account.
